SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY: APOGLA "BLEEDS" FOR A CAUSE

"APOGLA for the Nth time had its Blood Donation Drive at the Rosemead Masonic Center last July 18 from 8am to 4pm," this was announced by the activity's Chairperson, Brod Michael Shane Miranda.

Out of the 42 registrants, there were 36 successful "donations" Brod Shane continued.

In connection with this, the American Red Cross announced an emergency blood shortage as the blood supply fell nearly 25% in June. Blood donors are urgently needed to give now to help ensure patients receive lifesaving medical care.

Platelets and types O positive and B negative blood are in such short supply. A big decline in blood donations since the end of May created a wide gap between supply and patient need. This decline puts patient care at risk. Presently, the American Red Cross is asking the public for more blood donors.

With APOGLA's recent Blood Donation Drive, we have saved 108 lives, as per Brod Shane's announcement "this service has come at a time too, when it was badly needed," added the project's Chairman.

APO-Kids Making Us Proud: Celebrating Achievements and Faith



Tim H. Almazan, MD: H Dermatology (HDerm) Progress Update

[Tim H. Almazan, MD is the one and only son of Bro. Alex and Sis. Irma Almazan]

Two years ago, H Dermatology was just getting started. In the summer of 2024, the practice was introducing itself to the Cerritos community through outdoor promotional tables, banners announcing “Coming soon for your comprehensive skin care needs,” and newspaper ads for its grand opening event on August 3 at 11900 South Street #118. Early materials highlighted medical, surgical, and cosmetic dermatology services under the leadership of Timothy Hermosura Almazan, MD — a Stanford-trained, board-certified dermatologist (and board-certified in internal medicine) who is a Cerritos native.

Those early image-based ads and community outreach events marked the beginning. The clinic opened as the first board-certified independent dermatology practice in Cerritos, offering care for conditions such as eczema, psoriasis, acne, skin cancer screening and treatment, surgical removal of growths, and cosmetic options including SkinPen microneedling, Biojuve, and Jeuveau.

Fast-forward to 2026, and the growth is clear. H Dermatology is now fully staffed, with a team that includes aestheticians offering consultations and support for the expanding range of services. The practice has added advanced offerings such as laser programs (including CO2 laser technology for fine lines, wrinkles, scars, texture, and discoloration), Hydrafacial, medical-grade peels, and other aesthetic treatments alongside its core medical and surgical dermatology. Hours have expanded to include select Saturdays, and the clinic continues to serve Cerritos and surrounding communities including Artesia, Bellflower, Cypress, Downey, Lakewood, Long Beach, Norwalk, and beyond.

Demand has grown strongly. Appointment availability is now typically three months out — a clear sign of patient trust, word-of-mouth success, and the quality of care provided by Dr. Almazan and the team. Positive patient feedback consistently notes a welcoming, professional staff, a clean and comfortable environment, and thorough, kind care.

From promotional tables and “coming soon” banners to a fully operational, in-demand practice with expanded services and a complete team, H Dermatology has made impressive progress in just two years. The practice remains physician-led and focused on personalized medical, surgical, and cosmetic skin care for the community.

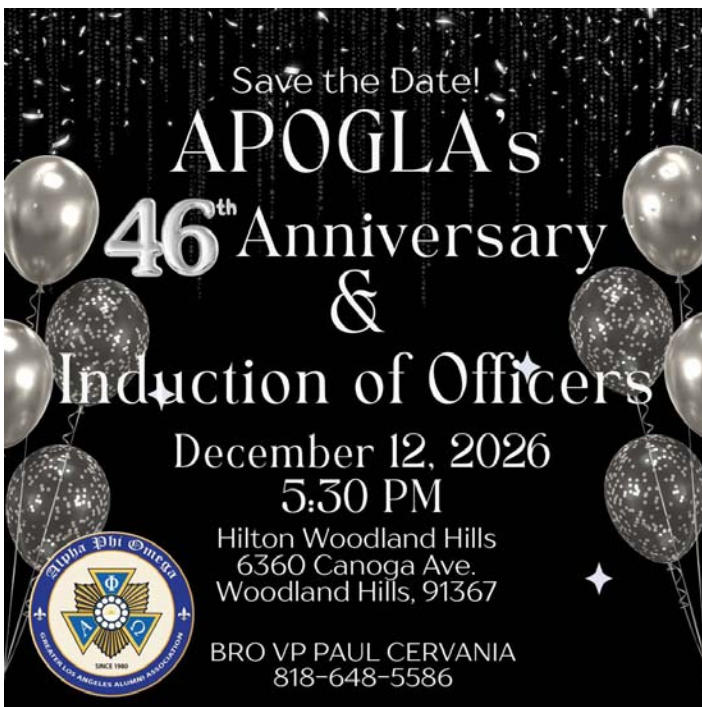
